Edgecombe County Recycling

What to Recycle and How

Material	Preparation
<p>Glass All glass containers, brown, green and clear. Drinking glasses, mirrors, window glass, Pyrex dishes, ceramics, and light bulbs are not accepted.</p>	<p>Remove lids, rinse out. Place bottles and jars in the glass container. Paper labels don't need to be removed.</p>
<p>Cans All steel, aluminum, beverage or food cans. Aluminum foil and aluminum food containers are not accepted in this container.</p>	<p>Empty cans and place in the container.</p> 
<p>Scrap Metal "White Goods" Dish washers, refrigerators that have no food in them, stoves, washing machines, water heaters, air conditioners, old farm equipment and other scrap metal.</p>	<p>All liquids must be removed from lawnmowers, motorcycles, go carts, etc.</p>
<p>Bulk Waste "Brown Goods" Chairs, mattresses, sofas, tables, and other furniture items. Commercial Waste, construction and demolition are not accepted at the recycling centers.</p>	<p>These items need to be taken to the landfill.</p>
<p>All Plastic bottles and Jugs All plastic soft drink bottles, milk and water jugs, dish detergent, liquid detergent jugs, mouthwash bottles, shampoo bottles, vitamin bottles and some medicine bottles. Plastic bags or containers that have motor oil, antifreeze or any container that has been used for petroleum products are not accepted.</p>	<p>Look for the triangle on the bottom with a 1 or 2 for recycling. Remove the cap and rinse the bottle.</p> 
<p>Cardboard Only clean and dry corrugated cardboard boxes will be accepted</p>	<p>Need to be broken down and flattened before putting in the container.</p>
<p>Electronics and Televisions Discarded computer equipments and televisions</p>	

<p>Recyclable Paper Products Magazines, telephone books, newspapers, junk mail, envelopes without plastic windows, computer and copier paper free of staples, colored paper, paper bags and cereal and shoe boxes Shredded paper is not accepted.</p>	<p>Must be clean, dry, untied and un-bagged,</p> 
<p>Yard Waste Leaves, limbs (no larger than 6" in diameter and no longer than 4') and grass clippings, No stumps are accepted</p>	
<p>Motor Oil Oil from vehicles not mixed with water or anti-freeze, gasoline or solvents of any kind.</p>	<p>Anti-freeze from vehicles is collected at the Colonial Road Site only. Please ask the attendant on duty for instruction</p>
<p>Oil Filter</p>	<p>Filter has to be drained before being dropped off</p>
<p>Tires</p>	<p>More than 5 need to be taken to the landfill</p>
<p>Batteries Car, light truck and tractor batteries Household (alkaline) batteries are not recyclable</p>	
<p>Agri-Chemical Containers Plastic pesticide containers Metal or non-plastic containers are not recyclable.</p>	<p>Remove caps and paper booklets. Thoroughly rinse the containers (pressure rinse probe or triple rinse). Puncture the container. The thread and lip of the container must be clean and dry.</p>
<p>Oyster Shells</p>	<p>Accepted at Baie, Colonial and Spivey Roads only.</p>
<p>Cooking Oil</p>	<p>Place cooking oil in a container with a tight fitting lid and drop off at recycling center or take to Colonial Rd. Recycling Center and put in container.</p>
<p>CFL Bulbs</p>	<p>Place in a plastic bag and drop off at recycling center</p>
<p>Wood Pallets</p>	<p>More than 5 need to be taken to landfill. Pallets need to be free of trash and debris.</p>

Why recycle?

Conserves Natural Resources:

Recycling saves natural resources such as trees and land and reduces the need to drill for oil and dig for minerals.

Saves landfill space:

Recycled materials conserves landfill space for future generations.

Saves energy:

The energy associated with producing recycled content products is much less than what's involved with producing products from mined or forest-harvested materials.

Saves Clean Air and Water:

In most cases, making products from recycled materials creates less air and water pollution than making products from virgin materials.

Creates Jobs:

A recent study showed that more than 14,000 recycling jobs exist in North Carolina, an increase of 12% in the last 5 years.



Do you know:

Materials banned from landfills:

The following items can no longer be thrown away with your regular household garbage, **they must be recycled.**

- Corrugated Cardboard
- Plastic Bottles (as of October 1, 2009)
- Oil filters (as of October 1, 2009)
- Wood Pallets (as of October 1, 2009)
- Aluminum Cans
- Yard Trash
- Used Tires
- Lead Acid Batteries
- Glossy Paper
- White Goods or Appliances
- Bottles from ABC Permitted businesses
